
Retaliation: The Facts



# The cost

"The total loss caused by the cases in our study exceeded USD 7.1 billion... it is safe to assume that the 2,690 cases included ... represent only a tiny fraction of the frauds committed against organizations worldwide during that time... while staggering on its own-[this] does not come close to representing the total amount lost


