8:45 – 10:30 AM	Organizational Ethics This session focuses on what an ethical culture is and its importance as the underlying basis for a strong culture of compliance and ethics. It focuses on the legal requirement of an ethical culture and the business value of one. The course also covers the current ethical landscape and the practical steps to creating and maintaining a strong ethical corporate culture.

10:45 AM – 12:15 PM	Introduction to Compliance Practice: Abbreviated Compliance 101 This course provides a basic introduction to compliance and compliance programs. It covers the seven essential elements of a compliance program and reviews the organizational steps necessary to implement a successful compliance program. The laws, rules, and regulations pertinent to compliance programs are introduced. Challenges confronting compliance officers are discussed.

Laws and regulations for activities in Europe, Asia, and other areas of the world are also briefly touched on in this session.

When a failure is detected, discipline shows the culture that enforcement of the organization's standards is serious. Program improvement is an analysis after every failure to see what can be done to which elements of the program to prevent the same failure in the future. The program is always a work in progress.
